### Dear brothers and sisters,

#### **Different priorities: Creation / Children**

So often in life is the challenge to balance different priorities. Likewise is the case in the rhythm of our united faith, such as this week. On the one hand, we've just begun (1 Sept to 4 Oct) what's known among people of Christian faith as 'The Season of Creation', starting with last Sunday's 'World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation'. (See the beautiful double-sided page of quotes available in the bulletin this week that's been put together for your prayer and reflection by the parish team). AND simultaneously, another priority in the Church and wider society is 'Child Protection Week'.

#### All of life – All of Creation

Reflecting on these different priorities, I began thinking of what, in fact, they have in common: From our Catholic faith view of life, 'Creation' is ALL of life. It's the universe. It's micro-biological life and a grand oak. It's river systems and ecosystems. It's a tender litter of pups and a majestic whale. It's the birds of the air and the mostly still unknown world under the oceans. It's human life in the nervous and awesome anticipation of birth. And it's that same human life as child and adult, striving for purpose and belonging, for love and safety, for hope and peace.



#### Vision towards Wholeness

All of this Creation is the arena of God's vision; a vision for all of creation to keep unfolding and emerging towards wholeness. St Paul describes it that all of creation is continuing to give birth (*Romans 8*). In our Catholic Christian understanding, we humans are not somehow separate to the Creation; but instead, we are relational within it. In our Catholic Church Encyclical (that is, a teaching document from the Pope) called *Laudato Si*, it is this sense of all of life and creation being relational and connected that is so central. And so to disregard Creation and all of its connections, is to disregard our faith. The loss and the harvest, the birth and the war, the refugee and the



abundance, the fear and the opportunity, the joy and the rejection; all are related lest we disregard God, whose vision is always relational, always towards a growing inter-embrace.

#### **Child Protection and Creation**

And so we come to a focus such as Child Protection Week: Especially since the Australian Roval Commission into Institutional Abuse, there has been a much needed, heightened awareness, in the Church and Society, of the destruction caused by the sin and dysfunction of abuse. And hopefully such awareness is maturing beyond only the needed guidelines and cautions; needs that are a minimum. Child Protection is more. It is about ensuring that our children are actively given the dignity and opportunity to flourish in their appropriate involvements in life, being safe and free to explore, experience and grow. And so back to the start of this reflection; we can say that child protection is deeply relevant in our faith, as a precious element in our care for all of God's Creation, children being one of Creation's most precious gems. Let's pray for each other and our parish, that among our ways to love God in the gift of Creation, is by our deep attentiveness to honouring the wholesome involvement in life of our children.


