Dear brothers and sisters,

Christmas greetings to you all – including those joining us at Christmas from other places and faith backgrounds. Whenever we gather, the diversity of people and stories is deeply part of what makes us 'catholic' – a word meaning 'universal' or 'all-embracing'. It is into this richness of all people and creation, that we celebrate and honour the human birth of God, in Jesus.

What I mean is:

And our own parish St V de P, with support of St Paul's College, gave the joy of hampers and gifts to 40 local families as part of our 'Christmas Embrace'!



The gift of God's human birthing into creation, is a decisive bonding of all creation, including all of us, with the divine. Try to imagine that; the human and the divine truly as ONE - now - and always! The birth and whole life cycle of the human Jesus, through to the reality now of the risen Jesus embracing all life, gives us incredible safety and inexhaustible possibility. We are permanent. In God, we are not able to be defeated or destroyed, only transformed, more and more.

Dear friends, may your lives be blessed with hope and peace this Christmas. May we all commit in many ongoing and new ways, to truly BE agents of hope and peace in and for the world God loves. Together, may we keep growing in our contribution to God's 'forever mission'; the mission of a vibrant oneness and connectedness of all life, all creation, in God!
