30th March 2025 FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT

## Surrendering & trusting God in the midst of Challenges

Life was comfortable, safe, and prestigious within the walls of our well-established school. The security of routine, the respect of the community, and the structured environment provided a sense of fulfillment. However, when the CMI congregation decided to focus more on global missions, especially in developing regions, I was given a new calling—an opportunity to serve in the Amazon region of the Archdiocese of Santarém, Brazil.



Accepting this mission wholeheartedly, I prepared myself for a journey into the unknown. Reaching my assigned parish in Almeirim was no easy feat. From Kochi, it took four flights to reach Santarém, and a 16-hour ship journey along the vast, untamed rivers of the Amazon to reach my parish, Almeirim. The transition from a structured institution to the heart of a remote mission was a challenge—one that required faith, resilience, and an open heart.

Looking back, the decision to step beyond my comfort zone has been transformative. The long journey was not just physical; it was a spiritual transition into a new way of serving, embracing the raw beauty and struggles of missionary life. The past now stands as a foundation, shaping my commitment to this new mission and the people I am called to serve.



The Amazon region, with its vast rivers and dense forests, was unlike anywhere else. Almeirim, a quiet, serene town on the banks of the mighty Amazon River, offered a deep connection to nature, but the rural setting also brought its own set of challenges. As a priest, I did not just minister to a congregation that lived close by. I was often tasked with the mission of serving communities scattered across the vast waterways of the Amazon, some accessible only by boat.

Once every two months, I embarked on a journey through the river to visit remote Catholic communities that relied on the Church for spiritual guidance. These communities were deeply rooted in their faith yet were sometimes isolated, with minimal access to modern amenities or transportation. The boat journeys were long and demanding, sometimes taking days, with the weather and river conditions dictating the schedule. It was a challenging form of ministry, but also a rewarding one.

During these visits, I celebrated Mass in small chapels, sometimes even in people's homes. The faithful were often humble and devout, holding onto their faith despite the hardships they faced in such a remote area. The sense of community in these small villages was palpable, and the joy of coming together for Mass, for prayer, and for fellowship, was truly a beautiful experience.



Living far from my homeland of India, I also navigated cultural and linguistic differences. In Almeirim and other parts of the Amazon, Brazilian Portuguese was the language of communication. I had no proficiency in the language when I arrived, over a time, I came to appreciate how language became more than just a means of communication. It became a bridge between hearts and minds. Additionally, the cultural exchange taught me much about resilience, resourcefulness, and the beauty of simplicity in life.

In the Amazon, I was constantly reminded of the vastness and vulnerability of God's creation. The river that wove through the region was a metaphor for life—constantly flowing, sometimes turbulent, sometimes calm, but always moving forward. It taught me to surrender, to trust in God's guidance, and to find beauty in the midst of challenges.



Daily life in Almeirim, though simple, was deeply fulfilling. There was a lot of walking, a lot of listening, and a lot of learning from the people who had lived in harmony with the land for generations. There were moments of isolation, but also a deep sense of connection with the people I served and the mission I was part of. The rhythm of life there was slower, but it offered opportunities to be still, to reflect, and to find God in all things.



I also found joy in the little things—the vibrant celebrations of local festivals, the generosity of the people, and the humility that filled the air. The people there had little by worldly standards, but their faith was rich and abundant. The food was another aspect of the experience that I fully embraced. I ate everything they offered, from local Amazonian fish to exotic fruits and traditional dishes. The generosity of the people extended to their hospitality, and sharing meals with them was a way of deepening our bond and experiencing their culture firsthand.

That life was about being present, being available, and being a companion to those on the journey of faith. It was not always easy, but it was an experience that deepened my understanding of God's love and of the universal nature of the Catholic faith, no matter where in the world I was.
