Gospel Reflection

In the film 'Romero,' which tells the story of Archbishop Oscar Romero of El Salvador, a supporting character named Lucia, foresees that her continuing struggle for freedom may end up in personal tragedy.

She asks a Priest, who is also involved in the struggle, whether it is all worthwhile. She wonders whether there is really an afterlife. If not, why keep up the fight for freedom? Yet, she chooses to continue the fight, knowing what her choice means. Eventually, her fears are realised, and she is murdered for her beliefs.

In our own country we do not face the choice Lucia faced. But we do have to choose whether to follow Christ or simply eat, drink and be merry. There is no timetable for end-times. But we have a clear agendawe are to go about our daily task of loving God and our neighbour and leave the rest to God. The end may be tomorrow or a thousand years away. No matter, it will come. Today remains a time of preparation. That is the task at hand.

In today's Gospel, Jesus speaks about destruction, suffering, and persecution. It's not an easy passage to hear, yet it carries a message of **hope and endurance**. Jesus tells us that even when everything seems to fall apart, **God is still in control**. What matters most is not the chaos around us, but the faith within us. "By your perseverance you will secure your lives."

The first issue in today's gospel concerns the end of the world. Jesus states that there will be an end time when the Son of man will come as judge. However, we cannot determine when that will be. Signs and incidents will precede the end, and we will be called upon to testify before kings and governors. The good news is that those who persevere in faithfulness to the Lord, will save their souls and enter God's eternal kingdom.



The second issue concerns the destruction of the temple. Jesus doesn't answer the question as to when it will happen. Instead, He warns his disciples of the many things that will happen before that time. False prophets will arise; there will be wars, natural disasters and persecutions. The many disasters that will happen could easily lead us to despair and convince us that we are victims of circumstances. Jesus says, "Don't be frightened!"

Jesus looks at the disturbing happenings as opportunities; Opportunities for his disciples to bear witness to Him and to the Gospel. In difficult times Christian witness is needed. It is in times of hatred that love is needed.

Finally, Jesus gives us this promise: "By your perseverance you will save your lives."

That is the heart of the Gospel today—perseverance. Faith is not about feeling strong all the time; it's about keeping faith even when we are weak. It's about trusting God when nothing seems certain.

So today, Jesus reminds us not to be afraid of the storms of life. Temples may fall, nations may tremble, but the love of God never fails, and His faithfulness is everlasting. Let us build our lives not on the fragile stones of this world, but on the solid rock of Christ.
