Living as Salt and Light

Introduction

Take a moment to picture the world around you. Millions of families, countless communities, and billions of people across the globe, each carrying their own joys, struggles, and stories. In the midst of this vastness, Jesus speaks words that reach every one of us personally: "You are the salt of the earth. You are the light of the world." These words are not meant for someone distant or extraordinary—they are meant for you, here and now, in your home, your family, and your parish. They remind us that every life, however ordinary it may seem, carries meaning and purpose. It is natural to feel small when we consider the immensity of the world. 
